The excitement of the Jeanne B. McCoy Community Center for the Arts began four years ago.

Since that time, the center has attracted world-class artists and performers, Broadway musicals, Pulitzer Prize finalists, NASA engineers, a full spectrum of music and dance, *New York Times* bestselling authors, and entertainers like Martin Short, Sara Evans, Mandy Patinkin and LeAnn Rimes. The McCoy Center has become the epicenter of New Albany's community, a core connector. It's a place that reaches out and encompasses learning, culture and an inspirational element to the community members.

With multiple sold-out performances, the McCoy has been a host to a wide variety of education and entertainment. With only three seasons under way, the McCoy Center has attracted patrons from more than 56 cities outside of New Albany and 95 ZIP codes, including six states. "The mission has always been to enrich and inspire the members of New Albany and surrounding communities in central Ohio," said Ted DeDee, Executive Director. "We are exceptionally proud of what has been accomplished in a short time."

The programming at the McCoy is designed to reflect the diversity of the community it serves. "When reflecting on the past few seasons, it is noticeable that when people come together in our theater, something truly special happens. Whether it's laughter or singing, foot-tapping or educational – people are connecting. That's the real magic of the McCoy," said DeDee. "The McCoy Center allows people to focus less on the ways they are different and more on the ways they are alike. Whether a seasoned audience member or

just exploring the arts, people who benefit from our programming efforts are people who like to evolve, expand their minds and interests, and essentially help create a more unified community." The McCoy Center plans to continue to bring world-class cultural offerings to Columbus, in an intimate environment with state-of-the-art technology offering an "up close and personal" experience.

The spirit of collaboration between the community and the center is a fine example

of what can be achieved through public and private partnerships. The inception of such a center as an inspirational, educational and entertaining venue reinforces the belief that to experience the arts stirs you to expand and dream, use your imagination. As Albert Einstein said, "Your imagination is your preview of life's coming attractions." For the Jeanne B. McCoy Community Center for the Arts, the coming attractions are inspiring.

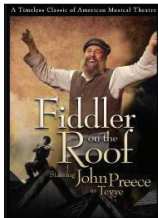

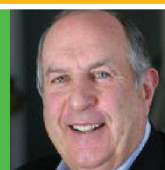
