BROADCAST OF NPR'S FROM THE TOP PRESENTED BY JEANNE B. MCCOY COMMUNITY CENTER FOR THE ARTS TO AIR NATIONALLY MAY 13

Episode airs nationally the week of May 13 and on WOSU Classical on May 19 at 7:00 PM

An upcoming episode of NPR's From the Top taped in New Albany, Ohio will be broadcast nationally the week of May 13, and on WOSU Classical on May 19 at 7:00 PM. From the Top, the hit NPR radio program featuring America's best young classical musicians and hosted by acclaimed pianist Christopher O'Riley was taped before a live audience on March 8 and was presented by the Jeanne B. McCoy Community Center for the Arts.

The broadcast features several young musicians from the New Albany area. 17-year-old flutist Audrey Watkins from Worthington, Ohio performs the third movement, Presto giocoso, from Sonata for Flute and Piano by Francis Poulenc; and the Mittlepunkt Duo from Worthington, Ohio, performs "Geistliches Wiegenlied" (Sacred Lullaby) from Two Songs for Alto, Viola and Piano, Op.91, No.2 by Johannes Brahms. The duo's members are 17-year old mezzo-soprano Michaella Cipriani from Westerville, Ohio, and 18-year-old violist Eva Kennedy from Worthington, Ohio.

Also on the broadcast: **13-year-old pianist Eden Chen** from Rowland Heights, California, performs Concert Paraphrase on *Rigoletto*, S.434 by Franz Liszt; **17-year-old percussionist Eric Goldberg** from Chicago, Illinois, performs "Scirocco" by Michael Burritt; **16-year-old cellist Bryan Park** from Bloomington, Indiana, performs "Capriccio" by Lukas Foss.

For the past decade, From the Top has been the preeminent showcase for America's best young musicians. Through award-winning NPR and PBS programs, online media, a national tour of live events, and education programs, From the Top shares the stories and performances of pre-collegiate musicians with millions each week.
